Menards offers ten colors, including browns, gray and green. They keep a third of their colors in stock and can have one of the others in two weeks. Holmes Lumber, on 33, carries pressure treated lattice, no plastic.

Wow...what a winter. I am certainly ready to welcome the increasing temperatures of the spring season this year. After experiencing several inches of snow over the past couple of months, it is time to experience some beautiful weather, Spring green-up and heightened business levels. I look forward to meeting more of our members, as the season continues, and everybody is outdoors more often.

A big shout out to Rick and the maintenance crew, for keeping up with the snow this winter. It turned out to be quite a task and resulted in some long days.

Security is still handling between 400 and 500 packages each week, so please be patient as these are all logged in before contact is made with our members. Randall and his team are doing a terrific job!

DID YOU KNOW...Governor DeWine has signed HB 669 into law; thereby allowing restaurants and bars to permanently continue to sell "to-go" alcoholic beverages? There is a limit of three "carry out" beverages per "carry out" meal. I don't know about you, but I find this pretty exciting!

Overall Lodge and Clubhouse business levels in 2020, and the first part of 2021, have been significantly lower than previous years due to COVID precautions. With reduced hours and seating capacity in both venues, it has been more challenging to get members in the doors for sure. That said, a big "Thank You" to those who have continued to support both facilities during this time.

Please note that the Clubhouse will be revising hours to reopen 7 days/week. As well, we intend to begin opening for breakfast once again. Currently, we expect to have these seasonal revisions in place by April 17<sup>th</sup>. Our Keno machine will be operational again beginning sometime between the middle and end of April. Ohio Lottery Commission will be coming in to perform an update on the machine and, once that is done, we will be ready to go. So, plan to stop by and see the Clubhouse team soon and often.

The Lodge will be reopening 5 days/week, effective the middle of April. We are bringing a new chef onboard, so please be prepared to welcome Aaron Gossage to our team. A quick timeline for the Lodge: After service on Saturday, 3/20/2021, we will close the Lodge for approximately 3 weeks. When we reopen, on or about April 15<sup>th</sup>, we will be open Tuesday – Saturday nights and will feature an expanded menu. We are looking forward to seeing more of our members, more often.

Also at the Lodge, we are working on a new seating area in the "beer garden" area in front of the building. By the time April 15<sup>th</sup> rolls around, we expect to have new seating and table umbrellas in that area, which is about 25 feet away from the front entrance. Note that smoking will be permitted **only** in this immediate area of the Lodge, although the smoking area across the street will remain as is. We look forward to this revamped area being utilized as a terrific way for our members to enjoy some terrific food, tasty libations, and your favorite tobacco product (we will supply the food and beverages, you supply the tobacco product).

Golf course fertilizers, chemicals and seed have been ordered and are expected to be here in time for spring applications. Please be sure to keep an eye out for the golf course maintenance crew when you are out golfing. They will be working hard...and nobody likes to dodge golf balls.

Also, a reminder that <u>any alcoholic beverages on</u> the golf course, must be purchased from the Clubhouse. Our liquor license covers the entire golf course and putting green, so bringing in outside alcohol is a violation of our liquor license and is punishable by revocation of our license.

# HIDE-A-WAY HILLS CLUB ORV RULES AS OF 3/25/17

# **VEHICLES**

- 14. Notwithstanding the above numbered Vehicle Rules, and the Off Road Vehicle Rules that apply to the designated ORV track and trails, the following shall apply to all Off-Road-Vehicle (ORV) operators under the age of 16 when using Hide-A-Way Hills roadways. "ORV" shall include, but not necessarily be limited to any ATV, Utility Vehicle, Side-By-Side, Go-Kart, Dirt Bike or Golf Cart. It shall not include cars, vans, trucks and SUV's.
  - A. All ORV operators under the age of 16 and their parent(s) must attend a HAH ORV Rules Meeting sponsored by the ORV Committee.
  - B. No ORV may be operated by a person under the age of 12 without a parent or responsible adult present.
  - C. Such ORV operators must understand and comply with the vehicle manufacturer's recommendations for safe operation and ensure that the maximum number of passengers does not exceed the number of seats in the vehicle.
  - D. In addition, helmets must be worn by all such operators and riders of an ATV, Go-Kart or Dirt Bike. Seat Belts must be worn by all such operators and riders in vehicles where they are supplied. Go-Karts and other low-profile ORVs less than 4 feet from the ground must display a flag extending vertically at least 4 feet.
  - E. The parents of all under-age ORV operators must read and sign the "Parental Consent and Release" form acknowledging the inherent risk associated with operating an ORV, and attesting that they and their child understand and will comply with all HAH rules.
  - F. Upon confirmed attendance at an aforementioned ORV Committee sponsored meeting, and completion of the "Parental Consent and Release" form, a sticker will be issued for display on any ORV to be used by an underage operator. No ORV shall be operated by an underage driver on HAH roadways without such a sticker clearly displayed. Violations of these rules are subject to the Schedule of Fines section of the Hide-A-Way Hills Club Rules.

# **OFF-ROAD VEHICLE (ORV) RULES**

The following rules cover use of the Hide-A-Way Hills ORV track and trail area. All existing Hide-A-Way Hills Club rules also apply.

- 1. The use of the ORV track and trail area is restricted to Hide-A-Way Hills members and guests on member owned ORVs. Social guests must be accompanied by the member.
- 2. Please enter the ORV track from the posted entrance point.
- 3. The ORV track is one-way only—counterclockwise. Do NOT go clockwise or cut the track.
- 4. When riding the trails through the woods, do not cross the signs marking the shooting range.
- 5. The ORV Committee strongly recommends that a certified helmet be worn by all riders.
- 6. The ORV Committee strongly recommends that participants riding in side-by-side UTV's fasten their seat belts.
- 7. Due to the possibility of an accident requiring a call for medical assistance or other help, the ORV Committee strongly recommends that riders not be alone on the track or trails.
- 8. Riders are prohibited from using the ORV track or trail area while impaired by the use of alcohol or drugs.
- 9. Ride at your own risk, and take care to not exceed your ability to control your vehicle.

The ORV Committee strongly recommends that riders 12 and under be accompanied by a parent or adult.

The parent or adult should be at the track but does not have to ride.

# **Proposed Change to Boating Rule #20 Regarding Watercraft on Small Lakes**

This will be voted on at the May 18 Board Meeting after being in two issues of the Echo.

Gas motors are permitted ONLY on the "Lake of the Four Seasons" - prohibited on other Lakes.

Watercraft on lakes other than Lake of the Four Seasons are limited to canoes, kayaks, row boats, pedal boats, John boats, paddle boards, and pontoon boats measuring not more than 13' by 7'. The aforementioned watercraft must be either self-propelled or equipped with an electric motor.


