President's Report

Normally, I highlight positives in my report. Unfortunately, this month, there are a couple of negative items that need major emphasis.

There have been several incidents lately where Security personnel have been verbally abused. These employees are doing their job. They do not correct people without cause. If you think they are wrong, tell them **respectfully** and then fill out a Security Report and send it to the General Manager. The form is on the HAH Website, available at Security and at the office.

The Board voted that verbal abuse of any employee will be considered an Article IX offense. It carries a minimum \$250 fine and possible loss of privileges.

Reports of dog's aggressively chasing members have increased. Rules state that "All pets must be physically confined or restrained upon the owner's property by leash, tether, supervision, electronic fence or secure enclosure to prevent escape." The Board voted that any violation resulting from the above behavior is a Class 3 offense with a \$75 fine for the first offense.

The Annual Meeting is Sunday, August 20. Registration begins at 1:00 but ballots can't be cast until after the 1:30 pm business meeting. Hide-A-Way Hills is a community run by its residents. To keep it running well, we need member input, involvement and oversight. Please plan to attend.

Here are a few friendly reminders for our members of barn rules and etiquette.

We have had a lot of traffic up at the barn with the new kittens and that seems to invite everyone into the barn to hang out and 'play'. With our signage, no one should be inside the barn unless you are authorized (being with a standing mem-

ber with a horse boarding).

If you would like to visit the barn, please be mindful of some good barn etiquette and safety practices that protect everyone including our horses.

Please do not feed or lay out food for the cats on the barn floor. The other day someone had generously left 'canned' moist cat food spread out on the barn floor with dry food around it for the cats. It created a huge mess as someone inadvertently stepped in it ☹. It also draws wild animals including opossum and raccoons who leave droppings behind that are NOT healthy for horses.

Please do not go into/or play in the hay bins. In what can only be described as a huge mess, a barn member's hay was collapsed all the way over onto the railing from someone playing up in the loft, and is now bowing the railing. It will have to be completely restacked.

Please take your trash with you. We have had all sorts of stuff left inside the barn and the surrounding picnic tables. We try to clean up so that the Barn looks nice and not trashy.

If you would like to feed the horses, please note that horses do not like celery or most other vegetables. Apples, carrots, store bought HORSE treats, and peppermint hard candy are all acceptable things to offer..... just watch your fingers.

Thank you for your help with this. Working together will help keep our barn nice and our horses healthy.

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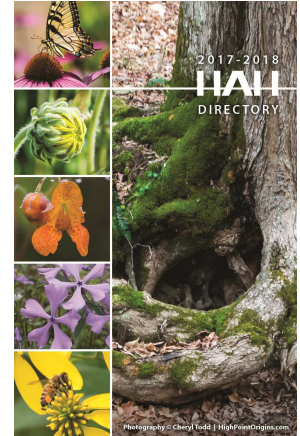

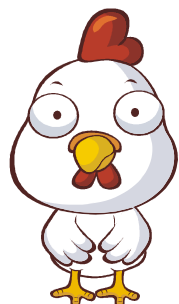

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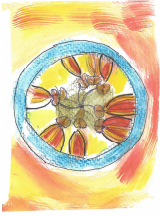
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2017 Garden, Arts and Crafts Fest was a Huge Success!

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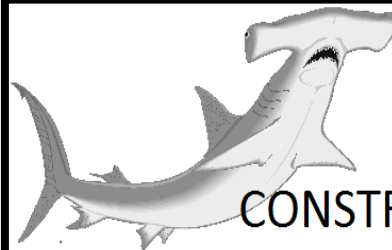

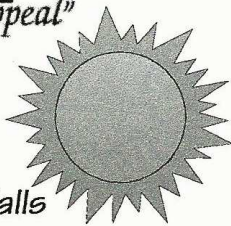

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NEWS FROM THE RANGE



August 2017

We have changed a few procedures and wanted to inform everyone on what to expect during their next trip to the range.

When you arrive at the range, we ask that you do not unload any weapons from your vehicle until instructed to do so by the RO on duty.

- The first thing that will occur is a review of the Safety Briefing and Shooting Commands
- Each shooter will then be instructed on how to properly place their target on the stand and take it to the desired distance for shooting
- After all shooters have placed their targets and returned to the shelter the RO will instruct shooters to safely bring in their unloaded weapons

Remember all shooters and spectators must wear eye protection, hearing protection and a hat with a front brim during live fire. Gun range etiquette is a blend of common sense, courtesy and safety. A day at the range is fun, and good gun range etiquette makes it even better.

Hours of operation are from 9 A.M. to Sunset on Saturdays and Sundays from 12 P.M. to Sunset. **Please be courteous and give the Range Officer on duty a 48-hour notice of your intentions to shoot.** Range Officer Duty Schedules and phone numbers are listed below for your convenience.

2017 Annual Membership Meeting

Explanation of Proposed Changes to the Code of Regulations

The Board of Trustees approved the following proposed Code of Regulations amendments to be presented to the Club Membership for their consideration and approval:

BALLOT ISSUE #2

The current Code language provides for annual increases in the Normal Lot Assessment based on increases in the U.S. Department of Labor's Consumer Price Index through 2018. The proposed change extends the effective date for such increases from January 1, 2018 to January 1, 2027. Since tying assessment increases to the CPI, the Club has been financially stable and has been able to avoid big dues increases. Dues went from \$137.22 in 2008 to \$160.97 in 2017. That is an average annual increase in the monthly assessment of only \$2.64. The specific proposed changes to the current Code language are provided below (~~deletions and ADDITIONS~~):

Article II, Section 4, A. Dues and Assessments. The dues of members shall be the assessments imposed pursuant to this Code of Regulations, as amended from time to time, and paragraph 8 of the Deed Restrictions for Hide-A-Way Hills as to said lots and parcels.

- A. Effective January 1, 2008 **2017**, the Normal Lot Assessment for a lot or parcel (whether developed or undeveloped) owned by a member or members, ~~was increased by \$9.22 per month to the amount of \$137.22~~ **IS \$160.97** per month.

Effective January 1 of each calendar year from ~~2009-2018~~ through ~~2018~~ **2027**, said Normal Lot Assessment shall increase each year by the percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban consumers (CPI-W*), as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor, for the preceding month of September of each calendar year as compared to the identical index issued for the month of September of the previous calendar year, with a limit to the increase of 5% of the normal lot assessment charged for the prior calendar year. In the event of a decrease in the index, there shall be no decrease in the Normal Lot Assessment.

These assessments shall be payable in advance, either annually, semi-annually, quarterly or monthly.

*CPI-W is the Bureau of Labor index that is tied to Social Security.

BALLOT ISSUE #3

The current Code language provides that the Board President shall appoint members of the Nominating Committee in March of each year. The proposed change simply moves this date to January of each year in order to provide sufficient time for the Nominating Committee to complete its work. The specific proposed change to the current Code language is provided below (~~deletion and ADDITION~~):

Article VII, Section 3, paragraph 2 Nominating Committee

Composition and Timing. At the ~~March~~ **JANUARY** regular meeting of the Board, the President shall appoint from the members (two of whom shall not be the members of the Board) a committee of five persons, with the President as Chairman, to nominate members for the Board of Trustees for the ensuing election.

BALLOT ISSUE #4

This proposed change clarifies that ~~a before a Special Individual Assessment is enforced against a member, they may cross-examine any witness against that member at the hearing.~~ The specific proposed change to the current Code language is provided below (ADDITION):

Article IX, Section 2, b. Special Individual Assessments.

- b. Prior to any Special Individual Assessment being enforced by the Club against any member, that member shall have the right to a hearing before the Board or duly appointed committee and a right to cross-examine any witness against that member **AT THE HEARING**. Such rights must be exercised, in writing, within 10 calendar days of the Special Individual Assessment notification, or the right is forfeited. Hearings shall be held in closed session unless an open session is requested by the member(s).

- We are grateful to South Central Power for responding so well to our problems. They replaced over 40 power poles and we lost hundreds of trees. We are planning an event to recognize them for their efforts.
- The clean-up will go on for some time. MC is looking into how we can help Members with the process. We have requested a permit from the EPA to allow us to burn some of the wood and brush.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT – Jim Krygier

- Management Committee continues to look at how to best program the dam area. We are currently cleaning up the airport storage area and also evaluating other areas in the Hills where we might park boat trailers. We know we need to improve the appearance of the area.
- We experimented with safety bollards on the dam; unfortunately the density of the dam concrete makes it impossible to glue them to the surface. We plan now to place warning signs on weighted bases to ensure no one mistakenly drives down the dam.
- The search for a new Food Service General Manager is nearly finished. The only detail left to determine is the starting date. Please remain patient with us as staffing is a problem but I am confident we will solve this issue soon.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT – Randy Swetnam

- Delinquency totals – Assessments at 6/15 – \$55,072; Roads at 6/15 – \$10,590. Assessments at 7/17 – \$56,137; Roads at 7/17 – \$8,940. Dam assessment total – \$336,099. Dam assessment total will decrease once Igel is paid.
- Dam assessments are paid current or members are making payments.
- Storm damage - Tennis court fence, golf course damage, pool furniture and umbrellas
- Randy wants to thank all HAH members who stepped up to move trees/debris and cut up downed trees to help maintenance extensively. 500 trees, 30+ power poles and transformers were damaged. Special thanks especially to Paul Heimberger who was able to remove downed trees to enable access/path to the Bremen gate.
- We are considering alternatives to temporarily extend the Security office due to number of packages received on a daily basis. Currently Security receives 60+ packages per day; during the holiday season it will increase of course. Some ideas are being considered such as renting a POD or attaching a building with a walkway from Security to a separate storage area for delivered packages.
- The light poles are in and the base material is in. The specifications for the light poles call for 42" underground base and 4-6" above-ground. We are now consulting with Lindsay at 2LMN to make certain this will work for us. GFI outlets have been installed on the light poles.
- Maintenance is working on clean up and the chip and seal project as well. Our goal is to have Motopave completed before school starts.
- The septic system replacement at front Security/Post Office should be started by the end of this week, or the beginning of next week.

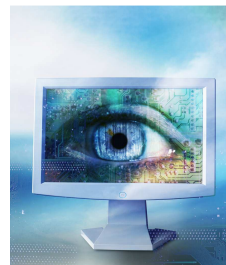

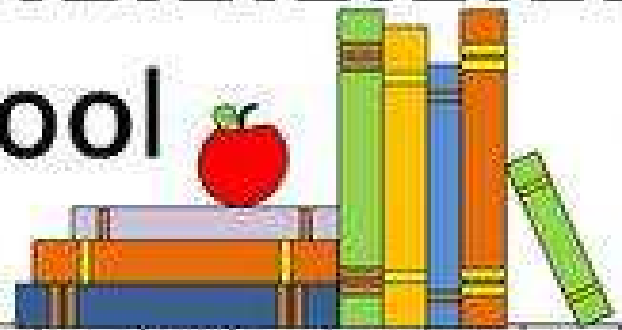
