Spring is finally here.

Get ready for another great summer in HAH. A couple of things to keep in mind are:

ODNR has designated that we are under a burn ban from 6 am to 6 pm during the months of March, April, May, October and November. This includes all open fires. In HAH any fire not in a chimnea or screen covered burning device needs a permit.

Members cannot call in guests if the member is not in HAH. Guests must be accompanied by a member when at any HAH amenity.

Thank you to the many volunteers that aided the Lakes Committee in the pontoon launch. Thanks also to the Long Range Planning Committee for the water and septic seminar held recently. A recap is elsewhere in this Echo.

A lot of North Park is newly seeded for grass. Please stay off those areas. The Park can be a great place to fish, especially with kids.

Speed humps are being installed. If you see a speeder let Security know even if you don't have a license plate number.

<u>Lodge</u> <u>No Smoking Area</u>

Complaints have come up again about being greeted by multiple people standing or sitting on the benches outside the front door smoking. People

do not like to walk through cigarette smoke to enter The Lodge.

It is our hope that smokers realize that in this day and age it's just not a good look for our restaurant.

Effective June 1st, the Lodge employees, following the instructions of the Management Committee, will begin asking smokers to stay outside the area marked by the no smoking sign.

Failure to follow the instructions will result in the need to take stronger measures to gain compliance up to and including being asked to leave or worse yet fines.

Smoking under the deck will also be prohibited, since the smoke rises up where people are dining.

We realize this is an unwelcome enforcement for smokers, but hope they understand that the smell of smoking is very unwelcome for nonsmokers. We hope smokers will comply now, but are delaying enforcement to give notice and avoid ill feelings toward the Lodge employees.

Management would consider a designated smoking area that is not an unsightly addition to the front to the lodge. MC Chair, Jim Kirk, has been tasked with gathering suggestions. However, there are no funds currently allocated for anything other than the current configuration. Please respect Jim's enjoyment of the Lodge; call or email him with any ideas.

Proposed Assessment Increase

The Hide-A-Way Hills Board and the Management Committee have spent significant time this year examining the Club's current resources, budgets, and budgeted reserves in light of critical improvements needed to maintain the quality of our community. Per Club rules, the current monthly assessment paid by members is adjusted annually based on Consumer Price Index (CPI-W). However, the assessment is not keeping pace with the costs that must be incurred to address road conditions, replace large equipment, and to repair facilities that are deteriorating.

For example, the deepening gullies alongside many of our roads are also widening and cannot be fixed via routine chip and seal applications; they require more involved and much more costly solutions. To complicate matters further, our large service vehicles and equipment must be replaced from time to time as they are used heavily for roads maintenance, snow removal, and other critical work. One of our four dump trucks was replaced seven years ago at a cost of \$95,000. Road needs are only a part of the issue.

Keeping employee compensation competitive, insurance, and many other costs are going up.

As a result of these and other needs, the HAH Board agreed unanimously on April 17 that it must propose an increase in our monthly assessment at the August Annual Membership Meeting. If approved by two-thirds of the membership voting, the monthly assessment would increase from \$164.69 to \$180.00. That will not change the CPI adjustment.

In May, members will be provided with details that describe the proposal in greater detail. In addition, informational meetings will be held in May, June and July to explain the proposal and get further member input.

HIDE-A-WAY HILLS CLUB ORV RULES AS OF 03/25/2017

VEHICLES

- 14. Notwithstanding the above numbered Vehicle Rules, and the Off Road Vehicle Rules that apply to the designated ORV track and trails, the following shall apply to all Off-Road-Vehicle (ORV) operators under the age of 16 when using Hide-A-Way Hills roadways. "ORV" shall include, but not necessarily be limited to any ATV, Utility Vehicle, Side-By-Side, Go-Kart, Dirt Bike or Golf Cart. It shall not include cars, vans, trucks and SUV's.
 - A. All ORV operators under the age of 16 and their parent(s) must attend a HAH ORV Rules Meeting sponsored by the ORV Committee.
 - B. No ORV may be operated by a person under the age of 12 without a parent or responsible adult present.
 - C. Such ORV operators must understand and comply with the vehicle manufacturer's recommendations for safe operation and ensure that the maximum number of passengers does not exceed the number of seats in the vehicle.
 - D. In addition, helmets must be worn by all such operators and riders of an ATV, Go-Kart or Dirt Bike. Seat Belts must be worn by all such operators and riders in vehicles where they are supplied. Go-Karts and other low-profile ORVs less than 4 feet from the ground must display a flag extending vertically at least 4 feet.
 - E. The parents of all under-age ORV operators must read and sign the "Parental Consent and Release" form acknowledging the inherent risk associated with operating an ORV, and attesting that they and their child understand and will comply with all HAH rules.
 - F. Upon confirmed attendance at an aforementioned ORV Committee sponsored meeting, and completion of the "Parental Consent and Release" form, a sticker will be issued for display on any ORV to be used by an under-age operator. No ORV shall be operated by an under-age driver on HAH roadways without such a sticker clearly displayed. Violations of these rules are subject to the Schedule of Fines section of the Hide-A-Way Hills Club Rules.

OFF-ROAD VEHICLE (ORV) RULES

The following rules cover use of the Hide-A-Way Hills ORV track and trail area. All existing Hide-A-Way Hills Club rules also apply.

- The use of the ORV track and trail area is restricted to Hide-A-Way Hills members and guests on member owned ORVs. Social guests must be accompanied by the member.
- 2. Please enter the ORV track from the posted entrance point.
- 3. The ORV track is one-way only-counterclockwise. Do NOT go clockwise or cut the track.
- When riding the trails through the woods, do not cross the signs marking the shooting range.
- The ORV Committee strongly recommends that a certified helmet be worn by all riders.
- The ORV Committee strongly recommends that participants riding in side-by-side UTV's fasten their seat belts.
- Due to the possibility of an accident requiring a call for medical assistance or other help, the ORV
 Committee strongly recommends that riders not be alone on the track or trails.
- Riders are prohibited from using the ORV track or trail area while impaired by the use of alcohol or drugs.
- Ride at your own risk, and take care to not exceed your ability to control your vehicle.

The ORV Committee strongly recommends that riders 12 and under be accompanied by a parent or adult. The parent or adult should be at the track but does not have to ride.

Well & Septic Workshop

Thank you to the Long Range Planning Committee for inviting both the Hocking and Fairfield County Health Departments for an hour-long informational program pertaining to our wells and septic systems. Below are a few tips:

- You can call your local health department if you experience problems or if there are any signs of system failure.
- Divert sources of water, like roof drains, footer drains and sump pumps away from the system.
- Do not allow anyone to drive or park anything over your septic system.
- Don't use septic additives. They usually do not help and can be harmful to the operation of your system.
- Eliminate or reduce the use of a garbage disposal.
- Don't use your toilet or disposal as a trash can.
- Never pour chemicals or cleaners such as paint, varnish, thinners or pesticides down the drain/toilet.

Do's and Don'ts

Your sewage treatment system is designed to collect waste water from the home and treat the microbes contained in the effluent while also disposing of the water. Care and maintenance of your system is extremely important for maximizing the life of the system and protecting the environment.

DO

- DO repair any leaking faucets and toilets.
- DO conserve water to reduce the amount of wastewater that must be treated and disposed.
- DO space laundry throughout the week to prevent overloading the treatment system.
- DO have the tank pumped every 3-5 years by a licensed sewage hauler (lists available at health dept.).
- DO call a professional or the health department when you have problems.
- DO alternate use of your leach fields every six months, if present.
- DO replace aerator motor with same make and model that came with system.
- DO inspect and clean aerator motor on a monthly basis to remove hair and lint from aspirator shaft.
- DO clean effluent filter at outlet of tank, if present.

DON'T

- DON'T dig in or build over your leach field.
- DON'T discharge basement sump pumps or outdoor drains (roof or driveway) into the sewage treatment system. Excess water can overload the system.
- DON'T plant root vegetables in the drainfield.
- DON'T plant trees or woody shrubbery over or near the leach field as the roots may plug the lines.
- DON'T compact the soil or drive over the fields with cars, trucks, farm machinery, or heavy equipment.
- DON'T cover the leach fields with hard surfaces such as concrete or asphalt. Grass is the best cover as it will help prevent erosion and help remove excess water.

Burn Policy in HAH



On page 2 of the Hide-A-Way Hills Club Rules is the following:

BURNING WITHIN HIDE-A-WAY HILLS BOUNDARIES

- a. Chimneas or other screen-covered burning devices are permitted; however, OPEN fires must be contained in a fire pit, not to exceed three (3) feet in diameter, be carefully supervised and fully extinguished before leaving such activity. OPEN fires must be approved by the Club office.
 - b. All other open burning is prohibited.

The statement "approved by the Club office" means you must get a written letter from them stating that you can have a fire on the dates stated on the letter. When you call the office to request a permit, you can pick the letter up at the office, have it mailed (if there is time to receive it before you want the have the open fire), or it can be picked up at Security.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Greg Ptacin

Two following rules are often misunderstood.

- ODNR has designated that we are under a burn ban from 6 am to 6 pm during the months of March, April, May, October and November. This includes all open fire permits. You still need a HAH permit for open burning at all times.
- Members cannot call in guests if the member is not in HAH. Guests must be accompanied by a member when at any HAH
 amenity.

A lot of North Park is newly seeded for grass. Please stay off those areas. The Park can be a great place to fish, especially with kids

Speed humps are being stalled. If you see a speeder let security know even if you don't have a license plate number.

AIR STRIP DISCUSSION

Jim Lloyd started a discussion about the why the airport is important to HAH. He stated the cost is around \$3000 a year to maintain. This includes insurance, maintenance (62 hours per year) and fuel costs. Grass can be about six inches for planes to land safely according to members. Jim stated it should be kept open because it is on the air craft charts as a restricted airport, but can be used for emergency landing. It is the only airport in Hocking County. It's used by Med-Flight in life threatening situations. We're the only lakes community that has an airport out of 24 Ohio lake communities.

Radio Controlled flying is done at the air strip and this is the only place that it is allowed. It is a very important amenity. If we take this airstrip down and want to reinstall it later, the federal government controls it and could hinder this significantly. It will be referred back to management committee. Multiple board members spoke in support of keeping in the airport.

The new database is still slated to be finished by middle of May. We did cash a Money Market certificate and paid into a couple of amenities funds that were still owed. We've been working on how to address the roads and fixing them up. Problems with culverts are being addressed. We're comparing options for permanent repairing of ditches, including an estimate for total cost to repair. Management committee recommended to the board for an assessment increase somewhere between 10-15% increase. The new security building has been pushed back by six months. Mowing of the airstrip will be discussed at the next management meeting. They were just trying to lower the budget.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT – Randy Swetnam

Delinquency total as of 3/15/18 \$35,208 as of 4/15/18 \$34,269; Roads as of 3/15/18 \$2790 as of 4/15/18 \$3010; Dam Assessment account as of 04/17/18 is of \$395,749 with the interest earned.

Management has put together a depreciation list and we purchased a zero turn mower with it. We've also received the golf carts for the golf course to rent. We're narrowing our search of an electrician for installing the pizza ovens. They are three phase and this is an area maintenance isn't comfortable completing. We've got one more estimate coming in. This should be completed (hopefully) in the next two weeks.

This years' Ohio Lakes Community Association Spring Meeting is at Lake Cinnamon May 23rd & 24th in Ashland County. This is a very informative meeting. Registration will be available by the end of the month. Maintenance has been working on the dock boards and replacing the ones needed. The ice and wind has been slowing down the progress. Randy discussed what goes into the New Member packets. If we eliminate the code and rules from this packet, it would save over \$1.50 per packet in postage alone. It would also save on paper. Discussion followed about different ways to handle this. Emailing with a PDF was suggested.

Another money saving item is to go paperless with the ECHO since it is posted to our web site. Last year, we lost \$926 on the ECHO between the cost of printing and postage. The only income from the ECHO is the advertisers. We could give the members the option to receive it online only. We could just lower the cost by printing fewer. We could ask the new members to send an acknowledgment of receiving the rules so we'd have a sign off. Board then decided to let the members know that they had the option to stop getting the paper copies of the ECHO after discussion.
